
Tax Rate Overview & History





The district's total tax rate has decreased by 27.7 cents, or 20%, since 2013.

- With the passage of HB3 and tax rate compression during the 86th Legislative Session, the State basically sets the M&O tax rate.
- The M&O tax rate will be compressed further for the 2023 tax year due to an increase in taxable district property values. However, the extent of required tax rate compression is unknown at this time and most likely will be impacted further by the State Legislature that is currently in session.







Initial vs Informed Ballot




INITIAL BALLOT

INFORMED BALLOT


Q31. Having heard more about it, would you vote for or against the issuance of \$785 million in bonds for school facilities and the purchase of land and buses, which is a property tax increase?
